Improvements Based on Prior Years SLO Assessments

The Nursing and Allied Health Division has seen a significant decrease in enrollment in all sections offered. We believe Covid-19 had a great impact. Also, students expressed dissatisfaction with zoom learning leading to deficient CNA pass rates. We also believe that now students are back to face-2-face learning pass rates will improve.

Since the last snapshot multiple courses have been updated through curriculum. The Registered Nursing Program is in it's last phases of approval with the State of California BRN. We are hopeful to have RN students, August 2022. Also being developed is a Home Health Aide Program to continue to meet the needs of our community.
