## Women's History Month

*Honoring the Accomplishments of Women*

In the United States, Women's History Month traces its beginnings back to the first International Women's Day in 1911. Women's History Month is an annual declared month that highlights the contributions of women to events in history and contemporary society. It is celebrated during March with International Women's Day on March 8. In 1979 a fifteen-day conference about women's history was held at Sarah Lawrence College from July 13 until July 29, chaired by historian Gerda Lerner. It was co-sponsored by Sarah Lawrence College, the Women's Action Alliance, and the Smithsonian Institution. When its participants learned about the success of the Sonoma County's Women's History Week celebration, they decided to initiate similar celebrations within their own organizations, communities, and school districts. In 1980, President Jimmy Carter issued the first presidential proclamation declaring the week of March 8 as National Women's History Week. The U.S. Congress followed suit the next year, passing a resolution establishing a national celebration. Six years later, the National Women's History Project successfully petitioned Congress to expand the event to the entire month of March.

1916 - Margaret Sanger opens the first birth control clinic  
 1840 - Elizabeth Blackwell becomes the first American woman to receive a medical degree  
 1903 - Marie Curie is awarded the Nobel Prize for Physics for the discovery of radioactivity  
 1928 - Women compete for the first time in Olympic field events  
 1854-1860 - Susan B. Anthony crusades for women's rights in the United States and internationally  
 1906 - National Organization for Women (NOW) is founded  
 1920 - With the passage of the 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, U.S. women get to vote  
 1542 - Mary, Queen of Scots is the first known female golfer  
 1870 - Golda Meir becomes prime minister of Israel  
 2570 B.C. - Queen Nefertari rules Egypt, calling herself "God's wife."

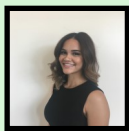
## ASG Baseball Ticket Fundraiser

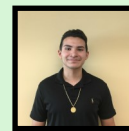
