 - Most faculty are not local for summer and require the student work to be mailed out to them, which causes further delays.
 - We cannot meet Title 5 regs for on-going, incremental feedback to students seven (7) times with only 3 or 4 weeks.
 - We will re-evaluate bringing these sections back for Summer when laptops become available for CDCR correspondence

students. We estimate that to be Summer 2025.
