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14	WHEREAS, Course Outlines of Record are submitted annually by articulation officers for
15	approval by California State University General Education (CSU/GE) as meeting all breadth
16	requirements and for inclusion in the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum
17	(IGETC);
18	WHEREAS Date Verde College establishes Transfer Articulation Agreements with surrounding
19 20	WHEREAS, Palo Verde College establishes Transfer Articulation Agreements with surrounding four-year colleges and universities based on Palo Verde College's Course Outlines of Record;
20	Tour-year coneges and universities based on rate verde conege's course outlines of Record,
22	WHEREAS, the course outline serves as the basis for evaluation of the transferability of these
23	courses and to substantiate their equivalence to courses of study offered at the four-year schools.
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25	THEREFORE, only courses that are comparable to those offered at the lower division level at
26	UC/CSU are deemed transferrable;
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28	FURTHERMORE, the course outline of record plays a critical educational role on campus,
29	because it is the primary vehicle for course planning.
30 21	WHEREAS, the expectations which serve as the basis of a student's grade and the fundamental
31 32	required components of a course which the student is guaranteed to receive from the instructor
33	and institution are established through the course outline of record; and
34	and institution are established in ough the course outline of record, and
35	WHEREAS, said Course Outlines of Records specify the required components of the course, the
36	content, and level of rigor for which students-across all sections of the course-will be held
37	accountable.
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39	FURTHERMORE, Title 5 (section 55002.5) requires approximately 48 hours of student learning
40	time per unit of credit: 1/3 of which is lecture with the remaining learning time dedicated to
41	homework/hours of study outside the classroom; therefore
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43	BE IT RESOLVED, the Best Practices at Palo Verde College include the highest standard of higher education as dictated by California's Education Code, IGETC/UC/CSU, and core
44 45	standards be implemented and practiced by all teaching faculty;
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47	BE IT RESOLVED, that all Faculty be held to these standards under their evaluations as stated
48	in the Agreement between the CTA and Administration.
