OCCUPATIONAL PROGRAMS COURSE EXPANSION

FIRST READING: FEBRUARY 23, 2010

WHEREAS, career technical education (CTE) programs often have students that lack the practical skills necessary for employment, such as customer service and basic skills;

WHEREAS, employers report that entry-level employees are having difficulties with the basic reading, writing, and mathematics skills necessary to adequately perform their jobs;

WHEREAS, students in career technical programs need to learn these practical skills in addition to the skills taught in their specific programs to increase their employability and success in the job market; therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, the Palo Verde College Academic Senate encourages career technical education faculty to work with mathematics and English faculty on ways to include basic mathematics and English content suitable to the CTE program in an appropriate manner; and

BE IT RESOLVED, the Palo Verde College Academic Senate encourages career technical education faculty to work with other disciplines on methods for including customer service skills in the curriculum.
