Significant Findings: HSBS enrollment and retention rates have remained consistent over the past four years. A notable change since the last report is an increase in Male, specifically inmate, students. We continue a four year upward trend in incarcerated student enrollment with a notable drop off last year. A second notable population change is a large decrease in female students since last year. While our course completion rates have remained consistent we have lost nearly half of the population female students, resulting in a four year low. Finally, there was a large drop in Foster student enrollment.

Conclusions and Next Steps: The drop in incarcerated students during the 2019-2020 academic year is likely due to the unique conditions of the COVID-19 pandemic, therefore intervention is likely unnecessary. The sudden drop in female student population is concerning and should be observed against overall enrollment in other divisions. Relatedly, it may be difficult to decide if there was a related male student drop since there was a notable increase in inmate student enrollment, which is disproportionately male. The sudden loss of Foster student enrollment is concerning, however it is difficult to make an informed conclusion since the Foster student population is very low.

mprovements Based on Prior Years SLO Assessments

The most recent program reviews were for Alcohol & Drug Studies (ADS), Child Development (CD), and Early Childhood Education (ECE). Given the results of the SLO assessments there is no changes needed to the programs. ADS, CD, and ECE report a minimum of 70% pass rate and all SLO's. All three programs discuss the differences across modalities, however ADS reports that it is too soon to make an informed determination and ECE and CD are currently too small a sample size to make any actionable decisions. The most recent annual snapshot also called for additional Psychology and History faculty; an ask which is currently being fulfilled. Further, anticipating the drastic need the division would wish to seek full-time and part-time ethnic studies teachers to fulfill the graduation requirement.
