NITES MALL NEEDLES --- The San Bernardino County Fire Department is tearning up with the National Fire Pro-tection Association for fire

tection Association for fire prevention week through Oct. 10. The campaign for this year is "Serve Up Fire Safety in the Kitchen" which works to achucate everyone about simple but important actions they can take to keep themselves and those around them safe. According to the NFPA

around them safe. According to the NFPA, cooking is the leading cause of home fires and home fire injuries in the United States. Aimost half (44%) of report-ed home fires started in the kitchen. Two-thirds (66%) of home cooking fires start-ed with the ignition of food or other cooking masterials. The SBCFD wants to have safety tips to keep you

The SBCFD wants to share safety tips to keep you from having a cooking fire. • Navar leave cooking food unsittended. Stay in the kitchen while you are frying, grilling or broiling. If you must leave, even for a short time, turn off the stove.

short time, turn off the stove. • If you are simmering, baking or boiling food, check it regularly, remain in the home while food is cooking and use a timer to remind you that you're cooking and

You have to be alert when cooking. You won't be alert if you are sleepy, have taken medicine or drugs, or consumed alcohol that

taken medicine or drugs, of consumed alcohol that makesyou drowsy. • Always keep an oven mitt and pan kid nearby when you're cooking. If a small greese fire starts, slide the lid over the pan to smother the flame. Turn off the burner and leave the pan coverad until it is com-letaby cool. • Have a kid-free zone of at least three feet around the stove and areas where hot food or dirink is pre-pared or carried.

# Firefighters remain busy with state's wildfires

ACRAMENTO — More than 16,600 fire-flighters continue to work towards contain-ment on 23 major wild-fires and one extended attack wildfire across the state. On Sunday, frefight-ers also responded to 26 new wildfires, bring-ing full containment to bert Fire in Amador County. Since the beginning of the year, there have been more than 8,300 wildfires that have burned well over 4 mil-lion acres in California. To date, the total num-ber of fatalities state-wide is 31 and more than 8,687 structures
