William Smith added the Mr. Ralph Black from the Chancellor's office had sent a memo to Jim Hottois that addressed this issue and several others called the Minimum Conditions Review. Dr. Hottois had assigned each of the Vice Presidents tasks that had to be corrected. The programs that are listed in the catalog that are not approved by the Chancellor's Office are: Building Construction Technology degree and certificate, Hazardous Materials degree, Child Development certificates and Computer Information Science degree and Small Business Development degree. There are two other programs that are in the catalog and not approved which are Natural Science/Math degree and the Basic Law Enforcement Academy. The Natural Science/Math degree has already been removed from the catalog and the Basic Law Enforcement Academy will be.

Bill Ponder added that the forms that need to be filled out for program approval and the instructions are in the Curriculum Handbook under Appendix A which is posted on the PVC Curriculum website.

Brian Thiebaux moved that the Instruction Office send a letter to Charlie Klein of the Chancellor's Office to verify that we are on the right track and to double check that we have the right forms for each program.

William Smith stated that the Instruction Office is aware of the issue and because of the research that has already been done by the office and by Mr. Ponder, feels sending a letter to Mr. Klein is unnecessary.
